HIT THE BOOK CLUB WITH *TWICE IN A BLUE MOON* BY CHRISTINA LAUREN

1. If you could have gone on a trip abroad for your 18th birthday, where would you have gone? What would you have done while there?
2. Do you think it was fair of Tate's mother and grandmother to keep her away from her father and his lifestyle for the majority of her life? Did you agree with her decision to tell Sam her secret?
3. Tate describes Sam as an extremely large person throughout the entirety of the book. With her description in mind, who could you see playing Sam in a movie adaptation of *Twice in a Blue Moon*?
4. Family and connection are both very prevalent themes throughout *Twice in a Blue Moon*. Which relationship (Tate and Marco, Luther and Sam, Tate and Jude, etc.) did you most enjoy?
5. In *Twice in a Blue Moon*, the authors added in selections from the script that Tate wrote. Did this help you get a feel for the actual filming of the movie? Did it enhance your reading experience? Why or why not?
6. When Sam tells the world about Tate's secret, she ends up getting the life she's always wanted—working as an actress and having a relationship with her famous father. However, Tate argues with Sam that what he did ruined her life. Do you agree with this point of view or do you think that Sam's betrayal enhanced her life in some ways too?
7. Sam makes a big decision that changes his life, his family's and Tate's. Would you have made the same decision in order to save someone you loved?
8. Just when Tate begins to think she and her father have started to form a real relationship, he betrays her and Sam. How is this betrayal different than Sam's and why do you think Tate should or shouldn't forgive him?
9. *Twice in a Blue Moon* is a book that centers around forgiveness and second chances. If you were Tate, would you be so quick to trust Ian again? Where do you see their relationship going after the book ends?
10. Tate, her mother, her nana and her best friend Charlie are all very strong women. How did you feel you related to these characters? Who did you feel most connected to throughout the book?
